SOUTH AFRICA

Documents needed for the customs clearance of Household Goods

Original Passport with resident permit
Customs forms DA 304 and P.1.160
Detailed and signed, list of values in English
Contact details
Detailed and signed, packing inventory in English

Useful information:

Migrants:

Household and personal effects may be imported into the Republic of South Africa free of duty provided they have been owned/ used for 12 months.

Customs forms DA 304 and P.1.160 must be completed and presented to the Department of Customs for attestation together with passport, Residence/ Work Permit and detailed packing inventory.

Importer on work permit:

As above. Together with certified copy of work permit.

Returning residents:

As above, plus returning residents must have been out of South Africa for an unbroken period of at least six months before they are entitled to duty free importation of household goods, unless these goods have previously been exported from South Africa (export proof necessary).

Foreign diplomats:

Household and personal effects may be imported free of duty upon production of a detailed inventory with a signed and authorised diplomatic clearance certificate.

Please be advised that it is important that we receive complete shipping and Customs documents from at least 10 days prior to the vessel's arrival to avoid demurrage and storage charges. Please note: shipper must be present in South Africa for Customs clearance.
