
SAFETY REGULATIONS

DANGEROUS AND PROHIBITED GOODS BY SEA

To protect your own possessions and to conform with various international regulations, there are certain items which should under no circumstances be included in your shipment of household goods. The following items should be disposed of before the packing takes place:

- Explosive substances such as ammunition, fireworks, flares
- Combustible gases such as gas bottles for BBQs, fire extinguishers
- Flammable liquids such as petrol, paints, turpentine, cleaning fluids, white spirit, antifreeze
- Flammable solids such as charcoal, firelighters, matches
- Toxic substances such as pesticides, herbicides, insecticide, poisons, weed killer, chemicals
- Corrosive substances such as acids, oxides, mercury
- Other dangerous items such as car batteries, compressed air cylinders, oxygen tanks, firearms, swords, daggers,
- Plants, seeds, soil

The following items are excluded from transport insurance cover and should not be included in the shipment:

- Currency, coins
- Jewelry and precious stones
- Papers and documents
- Deeds and securities

The following items may cause a problem with customs clearance and should therefore be checked before inclusion in the shipment:

- Foodstuffs including baby foods and pet food
- Alcohol and tobacco
- New items
- Items in quantities that exceed normal household amounts
